First Step: Determine If You Need a Visa to Visit Vancouver, BC

Citizens of the US and Britain do not need a visa to holiday in Canada.

In fact, Canada has a visa waiver agreement with a number of countries. Visit the website below to determine whether you need a visa, and how to get one if you do.

Passport Requirements

All foreign nationals—including US Citizens—must present a valid passport, issued by their country of origin, in order to **enter** or **depart from Canada**. This rule applies whether traveling by land, sea, or air, and whether or not you need a Canadian visa.

If your passport is set to expire during your Twilight Saga tour, get it renewed prior to traveling. In fact, Canadian visitors may be required to be in possession of a passport that is valid for **six months beyond the period of their intended stay**.

Note that you should also consider securing travel *and* health (medical) insurance before visiting Vancouver.

Additional Requirements

When passing through Canadian Customs (whether at an airport or the US/Canadian border), be prepared to:

- Demonstrate that you are in good health.
- Convince an immigration officer that you have ties—such as a job, home, financial assets or family—that will take you back to your home country.
- Convince an immigration officer that you will leave Canada at the end of your visit.
- Demonstrate that you have enough money for your stay. (The amount of money you will need can vary. It depends on things like how long you will stay, and whether you will stay in a hotel or with friends or relatives.)
